The Election that is Decided



Election Day is just around the corner. In November during worship, we also celebrate two festivals which proclaim the election which has already been decided.

Christ the King and All Saints' Sundays celebrate that the Triune God elected Jesus Christ

the King to save the world and has elected the Church to bring this good news of Jesus Christ to the world.

The first Sunday of November is All Saints' Sunday, the day when we give thanks for those who have died and been buried at St. Paul's in the last year, and we also light candles for all the saints who have gone before us. We celebrate that those who have died live on in Jesus.

All Saints' Sunday is also a day when we celebrate that in Holy Baptism, God makes saints out of sinners, and in Holy Communion, God forgives the sins of all us saints. Jesus says, "You did not choose me. I chose you and appointed

Expenses exceeded income in September due, in part, to a decrease in stock value (\$1500) and the second half payment of property insurance (\$4000). Fixed expenses are one thing we cannot cut back on as council continues to carefully watch expenses.

Giving Food for the Holidays? Read This

Janet King passed along this note posted on Facebook by Tricia Anne Meyer about her observations from speaking with food bank customers. A few things to consider for your holiday shopping:

Tricia: So, I spoke to people getting food at a food bank and here are some things I learned from those in need:

- 1. Everyone donates Kraft Mac and Cheese in the box. They can rarely use it because it needs milk and butter which is hard to get from regular food banks.
- 2. Boxed milk is a treasure, as kids need it for cereal which they also get a lot of.
- 3. Everyone donates pasta sauce and spaghetti noodles.
- 4. They cannot eat all the awesome canned veggies and soup unless you put a can opener in too or buy pop tops.
- 5. Oil is a luxury but needed for Rice a-Roni which they also get a lot of.
- 6. Spices or salt and pepper would be a real Christmas gift.
- 7. Tea bags and coffee make them feel like you care.
- 8. Sugar and flour are treats.
- 9. They fawn over fresh produce donated by farmers and grocery stores.

- 10. Seeds are cool in Spring and Summer because growing can be easy for some.
- 11. They rarely get fresh meat.
- 12. Tuna and crackers make a good lunch.
- 13. Hamburger Helper goes nowhere without ground beef.
- 14. They get lots of peanut butter and jelly but usually not sandwich bread.


