Hope, Peace, Joy, Love This Christmas



There is so much happening in the world that is distressing and cause for fear and despair. From the wars in Ukraine and Israel-Palestine to mass shootings here in the United States, it may sometimes seem like there is more to grieve than to celebrate this Christmas.

This darkness in the

world is precisely why the Light of the World became incarnate. The depth of human brokenness and the magnitude of evil is precisely why Jesus Christ was born, died on the cross, and raised again: to rescue this world which God so loves.

During Advent, we light the candles on the Advent wreath; in the Protestant tradition, these candles are called the Hope, Peace, Joy, and love candles. Each candle reminds us that

Council Corner

The Finance report revealed that operating expenses exceeded income by ~ \$7400 in October. A great deal of the November Council meeting was used to discuss this recurring trend and potential options/strategies to sustain the church. It is hoped that members of the congregations will participate in joint activities with other small congregations to learn from each other and perhaps consolidate resources for Fellowship activities.

Council approved a request to host an event and brunch for the Cincinnati Conference Southern Ohio WELCA (men invited too!) Spring Gathering on Saturday, April 13, 2024 @ 11AM. Pastor Emily informally surveyed members who responded favorably and are willing to help with the event. It was also approved to offer a Thrivent card to help defray the expenses


